<u>Royal Yacht Squadron IOW Foundation</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged 15 – 29 • Must be an Isle of Wight resident • Funded amount based on a case to case basis
<u>Milo Hanlon Bursary</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged need to be 17 – 25 • Must show a strong financial need • Must be able to demonstrate how they have perused their passion for the marine industry • Can fund up to £2000 (Can be more if a resident of the Lake District)
<u>Stephen Thomas Bursary</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged need to be 17 – 25 • Must show a strong financial need • Can fund up to £2000
<u>Noel Lister Memorial Fund</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged need to be 17 – 25 • Must show a strong financial need • Can fund up to 90% of the course fee's
<u>Royal Merchant Navy Education Fund</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parent must have served in the Royal Merchant Navy • Funding will be assessed on a case to case basis by a board of trustees • Can involve a home visit and is means tested
<u>Trinity House</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged 18 – 25 • Display a clear welfare need • Grade B or higher in Maths and 5 GCSE's A-C to include English & Science. • A minimum of 120 UCAS points. (48 points in the new system) • Must have A-Levels in academic subjects
<u>Seafarers UK</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants need to be aged 18 – 25 • Display a clear welfare need • Where possible have a family connection to any of the following: Merchant Navy, Royal Navy, Royal Marines or Fishing Fleets. • A minimum of 120 UCAS points. (48 points in the new system)
<u>Career Development Loan</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Between 18 and 69 years of age. • A UK citizen. • Not subject to any County Court Judgments (CCJs), been declared bankrupt or defaulted on any credit agreement in the last 6 years. • Planning to work in the UK, European Union (EU) or European Economic Area (EEA) after the course. • Unable to finance the course yourself with reasonable or adequate access to funds.
